

Perennials



NATIVE

Butterfly weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*): Full sun; Milkweed with small orange flowers support pollinators; attracts butterflies & hummingbirds; June-August blooms



NATIVE

Swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*): Full sun; pinky blooms in July to August; great for pollinators and a food source for monarch butterfly caterpillars.



NATIVE

Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*): Full sun to part shade; purple flowers with spiky center; attracts birds and butterflies; June to August blooms



NATIVE

Brown-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia triloba*): Full sun; darling yellow flowers with spiky brown center; will self seed throughout the garden; blooms July to October



NATIVE

Yarrow (*Achillea millefolium*): Full sun; produces dainty white florets with feathery foliage; attracts butterflies; June to September blooms



NATIVE

Beardtongue (*Penstemon*): Prefers full sun but can tolerate bright shade; Clump-forming, typically grows 3-5' tall, blooms late summer.



NATIVE

Hyssop (*Agastache scrophulariaefolia*): Full sun to part shade; clump-forming plant with mid to late summer blooms, purple flowers, fragrant foliage



NATIVE

Mountain Mint (*Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*): Full sun/part shade; great for pollinators, fragrant; vigorous grower, so give each plant at least 18" of space



NATIVE

Wild Bergamot (*Monarda fistulosa*): Full sun to part shade; unique flower head attracts pollinators; toothed leaves

Perennial Herbs



Rosemary: Culinary herb and pollinator plant, use in mashed potatoes, focaccia, and marinades



Thyme: Culinary herb and pollinator; spreading habit will create a nice ground cover; great addition to hearty grains and potatoes



Oregano: Culinary herb and pollinator plant, delicious in tomato sauce

Annual Herbs



Cilantro, Cruiser: Slow bolting cilantro with uniform habit; large upright leaves; seeds are easy to save!



Dill, Thalia: Slow bolting dill with uniform habit; grows 3 to 4 feet



Flat Leaf Parsley, Peione: Flat-leaf style parsley, great for cooking



Basil, Superbo: Italian basil—perfect for pesto and to add freshness to any Italian dish



Everleaf Thai Towers Basil: Great for Asian cuisine—rice noodle bowls, stir fries, spring rolls, and more!



Green Onion, Feast: Also known as scallions; great with eggs or as an addition to Mexican and Asian dishes

Slicing Tomato, Celebrity Plus: Slicer tomato; one of our favorite reliable reds!; determinate; hybrid; disease resistance



Slicing Tomato, New Girl: Slicer tomato; classic red indeterminate tomato; hybrid



Slicing Tomato, Pruden's Purple: Slicer tomato; dusky pink/brown; very full flavor; indeterminate; heirloom



Slicing Tomato, Marmalade Skies: Slicer tomato; delicious orange tomato; indeterminate; very productive; hybrid



Slicing Tomato, Pink Berkley Tie Dye: Slicer; dusty pink with green and yellow stripes; indeterminate; open-pollinated



Slicing Tomato, Tasmanian Chocolate: Slicer; burgundy fruits on compact plant well-suited for containers or small spaces; determinate; open-pollinated



Slicing Tomato, Woodstock: Slicer, bicolor pink and green, indeterminate, hybrid

Cherry Tomato, Juliet: Paste/cherry tomato; indeterminate; super productive with well rounded flavor; great for salads, snacking or sauce; hybrid



Cherry Tomato, Cherry Bomb: Red; indeterminate; hybrid



Cherry Tomato, Tidy Treats: Cherry tomato; container-friendly with a compact growth habit; indeterminate; hybrid



Cherry Tomato, Supersweet 100: Cherry tomato; prolific red cherry with hearty fruit clusters; indeterminate; hybrid



Cherry Tomato, Sun Gold: Yellow; indeterminate; hybrid



Cherry Tomato, Rosella: Purple-red; indeterminate

Peppers



Jalapeño, Jalafuego: High-yielding jalapeño plant with green, spicy fruit; great in pico de gallo



Habañero, Helios: Extremely hot! Orange, habenero peppers



Banana Pepper, Goddess: Sweet banana pepper for pickling or eating fresh



Sweet Pepper, Carmen: Red, sweet bull's horn pepper; ripens earlier than bells and are great for a garden snack; hybrid



Sweet Pepper, Red Knight: Red, sweet bell; classic bell shape; hybrid



Sweet Pepper, Escamillo: Yellow sweet bull's horn pepper; ripens earlier than bells and are great for a garden snack; hybrid



Sweet Pepper, Gourmet: Orange sweet bell; blocky and great for snacking or stir frying; hybrid



Sweet Pepper, Lunchbox: Red, orange, and yellow mini sweet snack peppers; open-pollinated

Vegetables



Eggplant, Nigral: Black Italian type eggplant; spineless plant for more enjoyable harvest



Eggplant, Orient Express: Asian eggplant with purple fruit and calyx



Cucumber, Sashimi: Very productive Japanese type with small seed cavities and subtle sweetness; hybrid



Cucumber, Diva: Thin-skinned, seedless cucumber with a crisp, sweet taste; 5–7" fruits



Cucumber, Corinto: Seedless slicing cucumber; fruits average 7–8"



Tomatillo, Toma Verde: Lantern-like fruit is great for green salsa; very productive; will produce volunteers in subsequent years; plant at least two for reliable pollination and fruit set.



Zucchini, Dunja: Green summer squash with short spines; hybrid



Butterfingers: Prolific yellow summer squash; hybrid

Vegetables



Celery, Kelvin: Home-grown celery is slow growing, but the taste is worth the wait; water well for successful harvest!



Swiss Chard, Bright Lights: Multi-color Swiss chard; plants may have stems that are white, yellow, orange, red, or pink.



Lettuce, Cherokee: Rich red leaves; slow to bolt with good flavor



Lettuce, Oakleaf - Bauer: Dark green, oakleaf head lettuce



Lettuce, Butterhead - Nancy: Green, butterhead lettuce



Bush Beans, Affirmed: Bush beans producing 5-6" slender fruits; more upright plant habit makes for easier harvest



Delicata, Delicata JS: Oblong shape; yellow and dark green stripes; tender skin doesn't need to be peeled; allow space for trailing vines!; open-pollinated



Winter Squash (Acorn), Autumn Delight: Classic acorn squash; semi-bush plant, still allow ample space for trailing vines!; hybrid

Annual Flowers



Cosmos, Versailles Mix: Colors in blush pink, white, carmine red, and pink; each pack will vary!



Strawflower, Choice Mix: Very pretty flower with papery petals; plants will produce either gold, orange, peach, pink, purple, raspberry, or red blooms



Marigold, Durango Mix: Yellow, orange, and deep-orange variegated mix, each pack will vary!



Borage: Edible light blue flower with cucumber flavor; plant looks magical and practically glows; attracts bees and butterflies



Nasturtium, Alaska Mix: edible yellow, crimson, orange, salmon and cherry-colored flowers with lily-pad leaves; variegated mix, each pack will vary!



Sunflower, Holiday: Golden petals with dark brown center; pollen is good for bee forage; branching habit for multiple flowers per plant



Tithonia (Mexican Sunflower): Tall, vigorous, branching plant; nectar is great for bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds, seeds will attract birds, allow plenty of space!



Celosia, Chief Mix: Crested cockscomb flowers; single-cut; colors include gold, rose, persimmon, and red shades; each pack will vary!



Celosia, Pampas Plume: Feathery plumes in scarlet, orange, bright yellow, pink, and cream; each pack will vary!



Zinnia, Benary's Giant Mix: Colors include deep red, orange, carmine rose, coral, lime, wine, purple, bright pink, white, salmon rose, scarlet, and golden yellow; each pack will vary!



Zinnia, Queeny Formula Mix: Zinnias with a softer, unique color palette including rose, orange, peach, lemon, and lime; each pack will vary!



Calendula, Alpha: Calendula has bright orange blooms; dry flower heads for use teas
